Mr. Bettan called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m.

Board Announcements

She had the pleasure of reading to Mr. Graham's class at Stratford Road. She received many thoughtful and colorful cards of thanks from the students.

Mr. Bettan expressed thanks to the community on the passing of the budget.

Mrs. Bernstein attended the Underclassman Awards, held for the 9th, 10th and 11th grades. She stated that 182 students were recognized. Congratulations to the students, teachers, their families and administrators.

Mrs. Lieberman piggybacked on Mrs. Rothman and Mrs. Bernstein's comments and added that she was impressed that the high school induction took less than an hour.

Mrs. Pierno, along with Dr. Lewis, attended the Orchestra Tea. Members from the Senior Citizens Club were invited to attend. It was a terrific afternoon with great music for the young and old. Mrs. Pierno attended Relay-For-Life this past Saturday kudos to the organizers.

Superintendent's Announcements

Dr. Lewis attended Relay-For-Life and stated what a beautiful day it was. She said that to date they had raised \$53,000.

Dr. Lewis attended the Val/Sal breakfast with Mr. Murray, Valedictorian Tyler Fenton and Salutatorian Evan Binder. She has invited Tyler and Evan to attend moving up day at their respective elementary schools. She stated how very proud she is of both Tyler and Evan.

Ms. Gierasch updated the Board on ZSpace tablets. She stated that they were pre-taped by WABC morning news; the show will air Sunday July 19th at 5:30 a.m.

Reports

AIS/RTI Report

Ms. Becker, Ms. Annino and Ms. Binstock gave an overview of the Response to Intervention Plan. They discussed the model as an integrated, school-wide approach: providing Universal screening, high quality instruction using research-based programs and methods within the classroom, frequent and formative assessments of student progress, academic support for at-risk learners within a tiered framework and movement through more intensive tiers. They spoke about the importance of differentiation in an attempt to increase student achievement. The important thing about differentiation is that it is pro-active and demands the reconfiguration of the various curriculum components. The most important thing about curriculum differentiation is that it respects and responds to student differences.

Discussion:

Mrs. Schulman stated that it is great they are using more reading programs and more monitoring. Her concerns are that by using RTI are they putting off children that would be classified.

Ms. Becker stated that it was hard to compare because they are receiving many parent requests.

Mrs. Rothman thanked them for their outstanding report and stated how great it is to see the success of the plan. She asked how the teachers are handling the scheduling and monitoring of the students.

Ms. Becker said that the teachers get full credit. She stated that there is ongoing staff development and a data team.

Ms. Binstock stated that they are able to use the writing rubic from their class.

Mrs. Pierno asked about the data.

Ms. Binstock stated that the data sheets are being handed off so they know what works.

Ms. Gierasch stated that there is a district-wide form and that the data is being processed through Infinite Campus. She stated that parents have access to some of that information. She added that every child who needs it is receiving services.

Mrs. Lieberman asked how they handle summer regression.

Mrs. Becker responded.

Mrs. Bernstein asked if there was an RTI person in every elementary building. She asked if they have all been trained.

Ms. Binstock stated that that yes there is and yes they are all trained.

Mr. Bettan stated a great job was done in keeping on top of the situation. Keep up the good work!

ICT

Ms. Gierasch stated that they are looking into the need for a 12th grade ICT class.

Mr. Yagaloff gave an overview and stated that at this time, they don't need a 12th grade ICT class. What they need are smaller sections and they would like to add two more sections making the total number four.

Mrs. Schulman asked about the large number of kids not being able to pass the Nassau Community College test and what is being done to change that.

Mr. Yagaloff said that along with Ms. Lynn, steps are being taken to move forward to change this. They are having great conversations with NCC and they are pulling the data and analyzing it student by student.

Mrs. Pierno asked if they will be looking into changes of the 9th and 10th grade curriculum.

Mr. Yagaloff stated that they are. He also said they are cluing in NCC on what is happening in the schools in regard to Common Core.

Public Participation

Ms. Danielle Wallowitz stated that she has three children, one out of the K-Center, one attending and one to go. She has been listening to many stories and experiences and feels that the common thread is that the teachers are amazing. Her question is why aren't we listening to the teachers about what's best for our children.

Ms. Nina Melzer stated that she has spoken at length on the topic of the K-Center, and feels that the Board is not taking the necessary time to make the decision. Sure there is space but she feels it's like comparing a limo and a Volkswagen and they will be crowded in. She urged the Board to take the time on such an important vote.

Ms. Shari Smilewitz stated that what looks good on paper is not always good. She hopes they do right by the kids.

Ms. Julie Shishko feels that "if it's not broke, don't fix it". She expressed her thanks for living in such a great town and feels that more time is needed.

Ms. Colleen Mack-Savino agrees about the vote being rushed. She feels that the teachers should be the number one choice for information. She expressed her concerns regarding the safety of the children if administration offices are housed at Stratford.

10.1 K-4 Structural Plan Resolution

Resolved unanimously upon motion by Mr. Greenberg, seconded by Mrs. Rothman that the Board of Education approve the following the following Resolution:

Be it resolved, that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education hereby modifies the configuration of the grade organization of the elementary schools of the Plainview-Old Bethpage Central School District ("District") as of September 2016 so that as of September 2016 and for all school years thereafter, Kindergarten shall be added to the District's elementary schools so that the elementary schools shall include Grade Kindergarten through Grade 4 and there shall no longer be a Kindergarten Center that includes and houses only Kindergarten classes; and

Be it further resolved, that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools and in order to accomplish and effectuate this modification of the configuration of the grade organization of the District's elementary schools as of September 2016 and for all school years thereafter, the Board of Education hereby determines and directs that the District, as of September 2016 and for all school years thereafter, shall assign all Kindergarten students to Kindergarten classes as per District policies and procedures; and

Be it further resolved, that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the District facility currently known as the Plainview-Old Bethpage Kindergarten Center, which is attached to the facility known as the Stratford Road Elementary School, shall as of September 2016 cease to exist and shall no longer be known as the Plainview-Old Bethpage Kindergarten Center and as of September 2016 and for all school years thereafter, the current Plainview-Old Bethpage Kindergarten Center facility shall be assumed into the attached Stratford Road Elementary School for use as part of the Kindergarten through Grade 4 Stratford Road Elementary School, or for any other use as required or determined by the Board of Education in its discretion; and

Be it further resolved, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes and designates the Superintendent of Schools and/or her designee, after consultation with the Board of Education, to submit and/or provide any form, addenda and/or information that may required by the New York State Education Department ("SED") in order to accomplish and effectuate said modification of the configuration of the grade organization of the District's elementary schools.

Discussion:

Mrs. Lieberman stated her concerns about space at Parkway and Pasadena. She asked if they will be adding the two rooms at each school at the same time. She asked about staffing.

Dr. Lewis stated that it will be at the direction of the Board but this is her recommendation. The staffing will be addressed, by sections, as they always have.

Mrs. Bernstein asked about the XR program. She stated that there are three teachers and four building.

Dr. Lewis stated that there will be one teacher at each elementary school. This was an over site and one more teacher will be added.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that she wants our teachers to be part of the process. They should have a chance to see their classrooms. She feels that adjustments will have to be made, and hopes the move will be a positive one.

Mrs. Bernstein stated that her philosophy from 20 years ago has not changed. She believes that the best setting for the students is to be in a K-4 building, academically, socially and emotionally. She stated that one of her main concerns has been with the space, but with the addition of the two rooms to be built at Parkway and Pasadena they will have the room to bring the Kindergarteners back to their home schools. She stated that she has not come to this decision lightly. She has listened very carefully, read every comment, spoken to and argued with other Board members. She stated that this is not a happy decision, however; she believes that it is the right decision for ours kids and community.

Mrs. Schulman echoed Mrs. Bernstein. She stated that she firmly believes that this is the best educational decision. She stated that each building has its own culture and noted that something will be lost. She knows that it will be painful, but feels that this is the best decision for the district.

Mrs. Lieberman stated how hard this decision has been. She spoke about how special the K-Center has been for the staff and the little people. She expressed her concerns over growth in Plainview. She stated that being on the Board is being in the kid business and doing what's right for the kids. She said that by separating emotion from this, she knows that the staff is going to make it work, and that this is the best thing for the community.

Mr. Greenberg stated that he has been very verbal over the last few months. He stated that as a parent with four kids eight and younger, he will be directly impacted. He stated that this has not been a rushed decision. He agreed with Mrs. Lieberman that we are in the kid business and we need to do what's best for the kids. He is under no illusion that there will not be bumps in the road, but with the wonderful teachers, staff and administration it will all work out.

Mr. Bettan stressed that this Board wants to make sure that the transition goes smoothly, and we will all need to work together for the kids.
