BOE Recognition

Mr. Bettan announced that tonight they will be honoring two Board members who are retiring, Evy Rothman and Amy Pierno. He stated that Evy has served on the Board for 21 years and Amy for 6 years. He thanked them for all of their years of service to the children of the Plainview-Old Bethpage community; they will both be tremendously missed.

Mrs. Schulman, Mrs. Bernstein, Mr. Greenberg and Mrs. Lieberman spoke of all of the wonderful accomplishments both Evy and Amy have achieved.

Dr. Lodico created a song in a tribute to each Amy and Evy.

Dr. Lewis presented Mrs. Pierno with a resolution stating all of her many accomplishments. She thanked Amy for being one of the Board members who brought her in and supported her work here.

Mrs. Pierno spoke to her fellow Board Members saying, that until you have experienced it, it is hard to understand what it is to be 1 of 7 on a Board with different backgrounds and priorities, and reach consensus and craft goals and policies together with respect for each other, as we do. We all have the same ultimate goal, which is providing the best education we can for our students. She learned a lot these past few years, and thanked all for their collegiality and friendship. She thanked them for their knowledge and patience with all of her questions, and she hopes that she has made 1/100th the difference for the students of POB. Mrs. Pierno thanked the principals, teachers and students for inviting her to their concerts, plays, celebrations, awards nights, and into their classrooms so that she could be a part of their world and share their successes with them. She thanked her friends, PTA, and community members which she has not even met for supporting her, voting for her, and sharing their opinions and concerns with her on a regular basis. The dialogue made her a better Board member. She thanked the community at large for being supportive of the Board and passing the budgets, propositions, and bond referendums. Mrs. Pierno thanked her family for their patience and support while she served the community. She stated that she couldn't have done it without them. Mrs. Rothman stated that she spoke at length at her party. She added that it has been a real privilege and a lesson in her life to represent the children and the residents of this community. The meeting was reconvened at 9:00 p.m.

Board Announcements

Mrs. Schulman spoke about the tragedy in Charleston. She asked for a moment of silence. On a lighter note, she attended the outgoing PTA President's dinner, and she congratulated them all. She announced that Mrs. Pierno was awarded the National PTA Life Achievement Award.

Mrs. Rothman attended the production of "Frozen" at Old Bethpage. She said that the kids were amazing and it was so enjoyable to see. Congratulations to Ms. Dubrow, Mr. Sidito the faculty and parents.

Mrs. Lieberman thanked Mr. Bettan and Mrs. Schulman for their year as President and Vice President of the Board.

Mrs. Pierno attended the SOS awards; all of the mentors and mentees were honored. She attended the High School Senior Awards; there were 146 community awards and \$8 million in scholarships awarded. She stated that the HS Chamber Orchestra hosted a fund raiser for the Nepal earthquake victims. She said that Mr. Rubin, besides being a wonderful teacher, also does a great job teaching his students that charity begins at home. She also attended the Thespian Honor Society and the Senior Citizen's 25th anniversary party. She thanked Jeanne Candal for her work with the "Frozen" production and Party Hardy for the screens used in the Frozen set design.

Mr. Bettan attended the Athletic Booster Club awards and dinner. He stated what a wonderful event it was. POB was awarded the "NYSPHSAA Scholar Athlete School of Distinction Award", which is awarded to a school district in which 100% of the Varsity interscholastic athlete teams achieved the NYSPHSAA Scholar Athlete Team Award. The Scholar Athlete Team Award is given to any Interscholastic Athlete team with a GPA of 90% or higher. He stated that this is an incredible achievement for Mr. Braico.

Mr. Bettan also attended the "Red Wagon"; celebration, congratulations to all of those who were honored.

Superintendent's Announcements

Dr. Lewis stated that the State is finally listening. They will be changing the date for APPR from September 1st to October 1st. She stated that next year in Algebra 2 and Trigonometry, students will again be able to take two exams and take the higher score.

Relay for Life Presentation

The American Cancer Society presented the Board of Education with a plaque. She stated that POB has been hosting the event for 12 years and they have raised more than 1.1 million dollars.

Mr. Bettan stated how proud he is to have a community that supports Relay for Life.

Reports & Discussions

Lice Protocol

Mr. Greenberg asked that the Board have a full discussion on the lice protocol at a July or August Board meeting, so that the can review the policy.

Mr. Bettan stated that they need to make sure that all of the elementary schools are on the same page.

Reserves Allocation

Ms. Maddi stated that this is the time of year to ask the Board to reaffirm the allocations. She gave an overview.

Mr. Bettan asked about the ERS reserves and how many years is that fund.

Ms. Maddi stated that they have increased the ERS from 3 to 4 years. The rates have dropped so there is no significant increase.

Tax Credits

Ms. Maddi gave an overview on the Governor's proposal on the four part education tax credit.

- 1. Tax credits to low-income families who send their children to nonpublic schools.
- 2. Scholarships to low and middle-income students to attend a public school outside of their district or a nonpublic school.
- 3. Incentives to public schools for enhanced educational programming
- 4. Tax credits to public school teachers for the purchase of supplies.

Mr. Bettan asked if they were independent or tied together.

Ms. Maddi stated that they were tied together.

Exemptions

Ms. Maddi gave an overview of the senior tax exemption. She stated that as of now the districts are split about 50/50.

Mr. Greenberg stated that more information is needed, and asked that this discussion be tabled. He asked if there was a timeframe.

Ms. Maddi stated that they have until December.

Public Participation

Ms. Patrice Finkelstein stated that as a parent and a resident of the district she expressed her thanks to Evy and Amy for all of their years of dedicated service. She commended the Board in making strides that were not possible prior. She thanked Dr. Lewis for her level headedness and strength, for taking on a fight that they never thought they could ever win.

Ms. Jacqueline Altstaedter, a parent of a 3rd grader at Stratford, expressed her concerns on the class sizes remaining the same from 3rd to 4th grade. She stated that during the budget presentation it was said that if the budget passed they would maintain class sizes. She feels that it was a promise that should be kept. She stated that Stratford is unique because of the push-in population of Special Ed. classes.

Dr. Lewis stated that the district is committed to maintaining class size and they will follow the guidelines set forth by the Board.

Mr. Bettan stated that they will keep the commitment to the class sizes and will focus more on the guidelines during budget time.

Ms. Danielle Walowitz expressed her concerns over the incoming 4th grade classes at Stratford and the Special Ed. children being mainstreamed. She asked if there was a known number of mainstreamed students.

Dr. Lewis stated that the guidelines include the mainstreamed students.

Ms. Jodi Acquaviva stated that she works for Coldwell Banker. She said that at the present time there are 95 homes in the district that are in contract and will close within 60 days; they are mainly in the Pasadena and Stratford school zones. She stated that there are a large group of renters and 132 homes for sale. She feels that the trend is pointing to older residents moving out and younger residents moving in.

Ms. Melissa Prushik stated that as a Pasadena parent she has concerns that their class size is at 24/25 students per class as opposed to Stratford which has 19.

Dr. Lewis stated that they will stay on top of the situation and make an informed decision later in the summer, before portal day, August 26th.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that the Board will get a report in the summer and they will discuss it in the summer.

Ms. Kathy Rea stated that they held a PTA officers training session last week and she complimented the technology staff on a job well done. She stated what a great year it has been and all that they have accomplished. Good luck to Amy and Evy.

Mr. Jacques Wolfner asked for a full discussion on many agenda items.
