There were approximately 200 district residents and staff members present.

Mr. Bettan called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

High School Performance of "All Shook Up"

Mr. Bettan was pleased to introduce the cast of "All Shook Up". They performed a few songs from their very successful show. Mr. Bettan, on behalf of the Board of Education, thanked the students and Mr. Olivari for a wonderful show.

High School Update

Ms. XXX XXXXXX introduced XXXXX, next year's high school representative. Ms. XXXXX read a poem she wrote recapping events over the past year at the high school.

School Visits by Board Members

Mr. Bettan stated that the Board has visited many schools during the school year. They went in small groups and got feedback from the teachers and kids. He thanked all the principals for being so accommodating.

Mr. Bettan stated that he and Mrs. Bernstein visited the High School. The tour was very informative. They visited a co-teaching model. He stated they saw students interacting with teachers. They also saw an alternative ed social studies project done by a student who has had moderate successes. This project was wonderful and a stepping stone for students. On another note, they saw that the Master Schedule is almost completed. This is normally done during the summer.

Mrs. Bernstein stated that she and Mr. Bettan visited Mattlin Middle School a few weeks ago. It was a wonderful experience. She stated they had the opportunity to speak with Principal Dean Mittleman, and Assistant Principals, Tom Schwarz and Beth Torreano who shared many of the fantastic things that are going on in the building with an emphasis on the positive climate created by staff and students at Mattlin. She stated they began the day by visiting Mrs. Peat's 5th grade class during their Book Talk. This is where students, in groups of five speak about a book they have read. asked if this process was more beneficial than the more traditional class discussion/book report. They responded very positively. They met with the Staff At Risk Student Team. Mrs. Bernstein was very impressed with the progress of the 8th grade ABA class they saw as well as their skills using the smartboard. They had the opportunity to observe a bullying skit. The students told them how being part of this has changed how they view bullying. Mrs. Bernstein stated that the visit gave insight into the teaching and learning that goes on in Mattlin as well as the positive climate that staff and students are working to create. She stated that visits such as this are very beneficial in their role as Board Members and hopefully the Board will continue them earlier in the year.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that she, Mrs. Pierno and Mrs. Schulman visited Plainview-Old Bethpage Middle School. They saw a lesson on the Civil War. The lessons were very thought provoking. The children took a test. Mrs. Schulman also took the test. Mrs. Lieberman stated they also saw a class on life skills. She noted that things we take for granted, these children are taught. It was a wonderful experience to see these kids. They also saw a production of "Oz, One Year Later". It was excellent. What came out of this production was conflict resolution. How you work together. She thanked the administrators and teachers for being so welcoming.

Mrs. Pierno stated that she and Mrs. Schulman visited Parkway School. They started in the first grade XR class. They saw a Fundation lesson which is a reading program. They went to Ms. O'Heir's first grade class and saw a lesson, "Guess Who". They also visited Mr. Beinert's 4th grade class to observe a math lesson. Mrs. Pierno stated they visited Ms. Stitt's 4th grade class. They were using smartboards in their science lesson. It was so interesting to see them work together. Mrs. Pierno noted that every lesson except the Fundation lesson used technology. She expressed her views that school climate is working in Parkway. She thanked the administrators and teachers for their hospitality.

Mrs. Schulman stated that on June 14, she and Mr. Bettan visited the Old Bethpage Elementary School. They visited ten classrooms. They saw Fundations at two different grade levels, visited an XR class, saw Read 180 in action, observed two social studies classes, a math lesson, and three classrooms that were using the Daily Five classroom management system. They got to see how the students had developed a vocabulary for talking about their reading and the different strategies they were using. Mrs. Schulman stated the kids were working independently or in groups. They were all focused on their reading activities and were following an established routine that they seemed to enjoy. She expressed her views that it was great to see the Fundations program at the different grade levels and in the different schools. It enabled them to see how the kids built on the vocabulary and skills they had learned in lower grades. Mrs. Schulman stated that they saw kids connecting poetry and art to the curriculum. They also saw rehearsals for the Wizard of Oz that other board members had the pleasure of attending. She extended her thanks to Ms. Gray and the staff of Old Bethpage for their hospitality.

Mrs. Schulman also extended her thanks to Ms. Paulette Miller and her staff for their hospitality.

Mrs. Rothman stated that she, Mrs. Pierno and Mr. Cepeda had the opportunity to visit the Stratford Road School. An electrical emergency occurred when they were there. She commended Ms. Clark, the Stratford Road staff and the Building and Grounds crew that went into immediate action. The teachers altered their lessons and learning went on. She stated they saw students preparing for their circus performance. This is part of the National Circus Project. She noted that this is adaptive physical education for our ABA students. They observed two teachers benchmarking with students while the rest of the class was working independently on a project. Mrs. Rothman discussed the Fundations Program that is currently offered in the first grade. It will be moving into the second grade next year. She spoke of what a wonderful program this is. Mrs. Rothman thanked Ms. Clark and the entire faculty for inviting the Board to see what they raise their hand for. She expressed her views that it is a valuable lesson for School Board Members.

Mr. Cepeda stated he had the privilege to visit the K-Center. He had a wonderful time seeing how technology is affecting the learning of the younger children. It gave him the opportunity to talk to the principal and discuss her vision for the K-Center.

There were approximately 70 district residents and staff members present.

Mr. Bettan called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Mr. Bettan welcomed everyone to this evening's Board of Education meeting. He was pleased to note that we will be honoring our retiring staff members tonight. He stated that we will hear a report on the tax cap. He stated that it looks as though the 2% tax cap is coming. Mr. Bettan said that the "cap" could be and should be interpreted as a 0% tax cap. That is what the wording in the proposed law states. If the community votes down a budget, the district will have to adopt a budget at the same level as the previous year.

Mr. Bettan stated we will also hear reports on how the district did toward achieving the three Board of Education goals: (1) financial, (2) school climate and (3) raising academic standards. Mr. Bettan stated we will also hear a report by Ms. Laurie Lynn on plans for the high school guidance department next year. He stated our final report will be on changes in the RCT safety net. He noted that Regents Competency Tests give students a second chance to get their high school diploma. He stated that it appears these tests are being phased out.

Mr. Bettan, on behalf of the Board of Education, apologized for the length of the last Board Meeting. Because of lengthy reports and discussions, public participation was pushed back to after 10:00 p.m. In the future, he stated, the Board will try to structure more workshop meetings that allow for more floor discussions while not inconveniencing those who come to speak.

High School Update

Talia Schwartz, our high school representative updated the Board of events and happenings at the high school.

Board Announcements

Mrs. Lieberman thanked everyone for coming out and supporting our Memorial Day Parade. It was a wonderful day.

Mrs. Lieberman stated that she, Mrs. Pierno and Mr. Cepeda attended the Nassau-Suffolk School Boards Association 52nd Annual Dinner Meeting. It was very informative. Mrs. Lieberman was proud to announce that Mr. Cepeda has been voted to be a member of the Executive Board of the Nassau-Suffolk School Boards Association.

Mrs. Schulman stated that on June 2 she and Mr. Jonas attended the ceremony honoring 150 underclass students. It was a nice evening.

Mrs. Schulman stated she and Mrs. Bernstein visited Pasadena School. They had the opportunity to visit several classrooms. It was a wonderful experience.

Mrs. Bernstein stated it was also great to visit the 4th grade class that had 33 baby quails that had recently hatched. She stated it was amazing to hear the students discuss the hatching process and answer various questions regarding the baby quail. They thanked Ms. Miller and the staff at Pasadena E.S.

Mr. Cepeda stated that he had the pleasure of presenting Matthew Herman an award for achieving "Eagle" status within the Boy Scout organization. This is a very high honor. He congratulated Matthew and his family.

Mr. Bettan stated he attended the DECA Award Ceremony. DECA is one of many things available to our students. It was wonderful to see so many children involved.

Mr. Bettan attended Mattlin Pride Day. It was a great event.

Superintendent's Announcements

Mr. Dempsey discussed possible changes in the starting times of our schools. Mattlin Middle School has no zero period. Parents and PTA have asked us to look at this. Cost was a factor. The transportation director prepared a proposal to change the starting time of some schools. We are sharing information. We are not talking about September 2011. We might be considering September 2012. The proposal would cause the K-Center to start earlier and the high school to start later. It is a trial balloon discussion.

Mr. Dempsey spoke of the Senior Awards Ceremony on June 13 and the many scholarships being awarded that evening. He also discussed the moving up ceremonies that begin on June 15 at the Kindergarten Center and end on June 26 at the high school graduation.

Ms. Gierasch was pleased to state that Tracey Gonzalez is a recipient of the 2011 Educator of Excellence Award. She was selected by New York State's most prestigious organization for English teachers, the New York State English Council.

Ms. Gierasch was very proud to announce that Amelia Ricketts, a sophomore research student is one of ten students nationally who was awarded a Samsung 2011 Scholarship. She will be awarded a \$1,000 prize. Ms. Gierasch congratulated Amelia and Ms. O'Donnell.

Mr. Dempsey stated that Relay for Life will be held this weekend. This is truly a community event. He also noted that at our next Board meeting we will be presenting student awards. It will be held at the high school and the meeting will start at 7:00 p.m.

Mr. Jonas expressed his views that our students do well because of the efforts of our teachers.

Mr. Bettan called a brief recess at 8:50 p.m.

The meeting was reconvened at 9:00 p.m.

Reports

1. Finance

Mr. Ruf discussed the tax cap. He stated it is a game changer. It takes away local control. It impacts quickly. If the tax cap were in place this year, the budget would be reduced by 1.5 million. The public would no longer vote on a budget. They would vote on a tax. There would be limited exemptions: 1) capital expenditures, 2) tort judgments 3) additions to the tax base. Mr. Ruf stated that unfortunately pension costs are not a real exemption. There is no mention of mandate relief. He strongly encourages people to get in touch with their representatives.

Mr. Jonas discussed the impact of the loss of ARRA funding.

Mr. Ruf discussed the impact of the increases in retirement contributions and health costs. He discussed the retirement reserve account that the district established. He reviewed our capital reserve projects that were funded through the Capital Reserve Fund.

Mr. Ruf stated that the District has worked with several law firms to support the pending litigation against Nassau County's plan to shift tax certiorari fees and sewer usage fees to school districts.

Discussion:

Mr. Cepeda stated at the meeting he recently attended, it was said that districts could have a 4% to 5% tax increase. He spoke to Assemblyman Charles Lavine about mandate relief. We will have to deal with it.

Mrs. Rothman asked if perhaps we should start our budget process earlier.

Mr. Ruf stated that all processes have to be looked at. You have to start backwards.

Mr. Dempsey stated we begin the budget process in October.

Mrs. Lieberman suggested that perhaps the Board should do a workshop. We have to look at years two and three to see how services are delivered.

Mrs. Bernstein stated that we began a process during the last budget cycle of assessing how various programs and services are being delivered. She would like to see this continue next year.

Mr. Bettan stated that this year we gave administration a job to keep the budget at a certain level. We then added to this bit by bit. We may have to make drastic choices. The deck is being stacked. He is worried about the zero tax cap. We might have to gut programs. He expressed his views that we have to call our senators and assemblymen.

Mrs. Pierno stated that we have to get community support. We have to let the community know the consequences of voting a budget down.

Mr. Cepeda discussed the sunset provision.

Mr. Cepeda thanked Mr. Ruf, the business office and other administrators for the fantastic job they have done.

Mr. Bettan thanked Mr. Ruf for the excellent job he did on the capital reserve fund and the manner in which he communicated this to the public.

School Climate

Mr. Dempsey discussed what was done regarding the Board's goal on school climate. He stated we selected and began conducting a school climate survey.

Mrs. Schulman encouraged parents to fill out the school climate survey.

Mr. Dempsey stated we created an anti-bullying and cyber-bullying policy in accordance with the Dignity For All Students Act. He noted that the State Senate is considering amending the law to change the name of the law as well as other amendments. Mr. Dempsey stated we created a dignity For All Students Task Force.

Ms. Gierasch discussed what was done in house on school climate.

Academic Standards

Ms. Gierasch stated we wanted to evaluate our K-8 curriculum to determine what changes needed to be made. This expanded to K-12. She discussed what was done in elementary English. She discussed summer workshop presentations with necessary components for successful writing. She reviewed writing units of study for grade 3, 5 and 6 next year. Ms. Gierasch discussed Fundations, social studies curriculum and Read Aloud. Ms. Gierasch stated that in the middle school level, we brought in a consultant to explore best practices. We will be implementing a writing program. Ms. Gierasch discussed what was done in high school reading, math, social studies, science and ELA.

Ms. Gierasch reviewed student performance data and how we are adjusting programs to meet our expectations. She spoke of the enhanced curriculum for all special education students other than those working toward the IEP diploma. She also discussed the new Common Core requirements.

Discussion:

Mr. Dempsey stated this is a status report.

Mrs. Schulman asked if Read About is being utilized.

Ms. Gierasch stated that teachers are familiar with Read 180. They are not familiar with Read About. We have to bring our teachers up to speed.

Mrs. Schulman asked how much is Castle Learning being used.

Ms. Gierasch stated we will provide a report on that to the Board.

Mrs. Schulman noted that when she and Mrs. Bernstein visited Pasadena, they observed a Fundation lesson. It was very nice to see that our students are so capable.

Mrs. Pierno asked if we could form an academic standards committee.

Mr. Dempsey responded.

Mrs. Pierno noted that we own licenses for math computer programs. Have we done an analysis of this.

Ms. Gierasch stated "not yet". We have to revisit some of the math components.

Mr. Bettan stated he is concerned about the pendulum swinging toward standardized testing. We have to look collectively at this as a district.

Ms. Gierasch stated that we have to provide teachers with a rich curriculum.

2. Guidance Update

Ms. Lynn spoke of the 8th grade transition plan. She reviewed the three prong approach. She told of the 150 students who were trained to be mentors. She discussed scheduling and the visibility of counselors. Next year we will have a transition to electronic submission of documents to colleges. This represents a big change.

Ms. Lynn stated that with the addition of the new counselor the caseloads will now average 200 students, down from 225. Students and parents will have more time to meet with the councelors. There will be a formal 9th grade meeting for every student. The additional counselor allows more flexibility for the department to explore additional programming ideas. She stated each counselor has a liaison responsibility.

Discussion:

Mrs. Schulman stated that transistion can be very tough for special ed student.

Ms. Lynn stated that special education transistion counselor could be very helpful.

Mrs. Pierno asked if we will be able to have individualized programming.

Ms. Lynn stated we did that.

Mrs. Pierno asked if we use Naviance.

Ms. Lynn stated you have to be on Naviance to send applications electronically.

Mrs. Bernstein commended Ms. Lynn for the changes. She requested an update next winter. She asked what would be covered at the 9th grade meeting with students and parents.

Ms. Lynn responded. Most important is that parents meet counselors.

Mr. Cepeda expressed his views that he would like to see our students continue to challenge themselves. Having a strong guidance department is critical to making that happen. He thanked Ms. Lynn.

3. RCT Safety Net Changes

Ms. Gierasch stated that the option to take RCTs will no longer be available for any student entering Grade 9 beginning in September 2011. She reviewed the requirements for a local diploma for all students with disabilities. She reviewed the requirements to appeal if a students fails a required Regents

Public Participation

Tracy Minaman spoke of an e-mail she received from PTA regarding starting times of schools and trimester report cards. She is against starting the K-Center earlier than it starts now. Children of working parents would have to be in child care longer. She also does not want to wait until December to meet with the teachers. She asked that the Board consider having the first quarter reflect a social grade and the other three quarters reflect academics.

Mrs. Cheryl Wolf is against starting the K-Center earlier. She stated no one is aware of the tax cap. She urged the Board to inform the community of this cap.

Mrs. Jane Pace discussed the possible change in the hours of the high school and the ramifications of such a change.

Mrs. Melissa Poechau expressed her concern about the possible changes in school hours.
